This report will be submitted to the National Fraternal Congress of America (NFCA). ## Strawberry Pizza

|------------------------------|-------------------------------|
| 1 c. flour                   | 3/4 c. white sugar            |
| 1/4 c. powdered sugar        | 3 Tbsp. cornstarch            |
| 1 stick butter or oleo, soft | 1 c. water                    |
| 1 - 8oz. pkg. cream cheese   | 3 oz. box of strawberry jello |
| 1 c. powdered sugar          | 1 qt. sliced strawberries     |
| small container of Cool Whip |                               |

Mix together flour, 1/4 cup powdered sugar & 1 stick butter or oleo. Pat evenly in pan. Bake 350° for 15 minutes. Cool. FILLING: Cream together cream cheese & 1 cup powdered sugar, fold in Cool Whip and spread over cooled crust. Glaze: Stir together white sugar, cornstarch & water and bring to a boil. Take off heat, add jello and let cool. Then add strawberries. Spread on top of filling and chill.
